Minutes of Meeting 30th April

After meeting KA found following omitted from Minutes: Bowling Club: Previous existing Football Club owe Bowling Club money for Water Charges – still connected thro to Bowling Club. **RMcI** to see Iain Campbell to ask if it can be turned off. Standing Charges costly for Electricity & Water; Bob Starkey to be asked about this

Matters Arising

Duthil Street Lighting in new development SB contacted John Beaton to say no ducting or lighting wanted

Granite slab and Interpretive Plaque Roy Brown still trying to get good photos.

Time capsule Reed Court In hand

Riverside Walk and Lochanhully path Survey to be circulated to CCC. Cost of about £44,000 with 90% Grant. 10% from other funders and /or Community Council. Survey to be put out to tender. Permissions from landowners still pending
Shed for Community Council use This should still be taken on. However Alan Smith has given us a free container 20' by 8', which can sit on land beyond Bowling Green. RMcI has someone who can move it, and he will check on access to this land. KA to check on ownership/leasing of that bit of land. PC E. Carroll expressed concern about security on that site, but it will be locked

Bowling green Insurance KA cancelled HC insurance for Club Hut Buildings and Contents

Village hall AGM Good attendance, including 7 of Hall Committee. Two extra members were appointed

Issue of keys discussed SB and LJolly cannot get one even by paying a fee. Very difficult to access for meetings etc. FMcM will take this to the Hall Committee. Also groups do not know about hall maintenance eg. youth group arrived and found they could not go in because floor had been redone

Carr-bridge Ahead KA sent email with copy of Insurance Document to LJolly but she did not receive it. To re-send

Cycle route alongside Aviemore Road We would like same surface as the track Kingussie to Newtonmore so road bikes and roller skis can use it

Car in Carr Wood RMcI removed pieces – only to get criticism as people view it as an interesting relic!!!

Registration of Septic Tanks SEPA require all septic tanks to be registered, and this will be free until June 1st. Very little information has been provided. KA to write letter to SEPA, Highland Council and Danny Alexander as more time is needed so Community Council can let folk know

Concerns of Residents and Any Other Business

A9and speeding RBrown has concerns and suggests average speed cameras (rather than static cameras) to reduce accidents. Dualling would also solve this but much more costly. Issue for Ward Forum – RBrown would talk to it

2 + 1 Road opening June 1st SB cannot go, invite passed to Community Council

Youth Project Meeting FMcM attended meeting co-ordinated by Karen Derrick on behalf of VABS who are lead organisation for Community Planning's intentions to progress projects. There are young people, who also attend, who are active in producing ideas

Scotrail RBrown met representative. PA system now working. First Scotrail are looking at community views on stations. Discussions on more trains stopping and screen installation. Main problem is cost of fares

Bottle Bank Was full with broken glass round it – hazard! Solved now, but suggestion that a number should be on them for people to phone

Hire of School Grounds and Outdoor Shelter Hire of these is separate, as Parent Council responsible for Shelter, but this can be roped off if not needed

30mph speed display Still on Grantown Road. In February it was agreed to ask if it could on up Station Road for a while ? for SBlack

Roy Brown was invited to join the Community Council, but he would prefer to wait until he has been fully resident in village for a bit longer
