Concerns of Residents and Any Other Business

Tom nan Clach windfarm Noted that windfarm is not in our Community Council area, but Carr-Bridge will be adversely effected by construction traffic. Two routes to be used: Large transporters, eg with turbines will go by A 95 to Dulnain Bridge and then back to Ferness turn. All other traffic will come along old A9, along the B to Ferness turn. Concerns expressed about economic impact of heavy traffic in a Highland village with many visitors. Inverness Road is one of our Safer Routes to School and several children walk up or down this road unaccompanied by adults. KA said that Developers have emailed to say that they would like to arrange a meeting in Carr-bridge and we need this to obtain full facts
