Minutes of 31st January 2013. Minutes proposed by FMcM, seconded by DR, and agreed with a prior amendment unanimously.

Housing Development Carr Road The two HC councillors attending did not take part in this discussion. Sam Sweeney explained the latest changes. Developers have had meetings with HC and CNPA on planning aspects also with TEC services regarding roads etc. Had a healthy response from the community both for and against and these comments will form a part of the proposal. Now 72 houses proposed and generally of smaller size. 24 will be 'affordable', Still want Carr Road access which the CC does not. Traffic study done on the road. Phase 1 will be affordable. Development over b5-7 years. Planning application will go in at end March. Individuals and CC will have 3 weeks to comment

Police Report Was circulated by email on 08/02/13. Nothing to discuss

Matters Arising

<u>Traffic calming</u> A McIvor has been slow to respond. AK pointed out to him that the CC gets the blame for dragging its feet although it is HC that is slow. LA said there was great difficulty in placing signs due to electric supply. No longer attached to lampposts. Must have own post. LA has spoken to Dalmore residents re positioning. Figures suggest this is the main area for concern. We will need to reach agreement with householder on positioning of signs. Agreed to ask A McIvor to next meeting. AK to arrange.

<u>Planning for Consultation re revision of CNPA Development Plan</u> Have heard no more. BL said that the plan is now available on the CNPA web site. CC will get copy and will have a 6 week consultation period but said we should act quickly. CR said that we should start arranging a meeting now. Or letter drop. We can request a large size map for meeting.

<u>Bike Park</u> Donald Powell was back on site on Monday and will again be working on the Park next week, weather permitting. A Fencing Contractor has been hired to put in a fence along the river bank, to look at erecting a screen between our site and the bowling green and to repair the high level fencing. There is a Planning Application for the erection of a shed on site and we are close to placing an order for said shed and have also looked into signage and publicity material as well. By the end of March we will have the Jump Park more or less constructed, if not all the extras put in place. By then we will be able to provide the Insurance Company with a date from which to effect cover, and, if necessary, have the Park signed off as being "Fit for Purpose".

<u>Drains in Reed Court</u> Nothing has been done.

Treasurer's Report

FMcM has circulated Accounts. Have had a request for money to help church repair roof. This is an iconic building within the village regardless of religious concerns and it is important to keep the building in good order. Will cost £20K. Church has 10K and will raise more. Asked for 5K. Unanimously agreed. Soup Lunch project needs some money for training staff in Food Hygiene Regs. Agreed to give £400 towards training.

The CC has funding available and will consider applications

CNPA may have money for 'Shovel Ready' projects so we should have some ideas on what might be done. Village Hall will be applying for funding again soon for their on-going improvements.

Oil buying group Bruce Murray has investigated and found that\At Regency will offer a 3p per litre reduction if we can take a full tanker 16500 l and minimum 900l delivery all paid up front individually. Not generally thought to be practical but will do a leaflet drop

<u>Windfarm routes</u> Heavy traffic will go via Dulnain due to low bridge. Only light traffic through Carrbridge SSE Open Day Invited to open day in Inverness on Tuesday 5th March

<u>District P/ship</u> Cllr JD spoke of the DP- NHS / HC + other agencies to discuss local issues & raise questions. Will be flexible.

<u>Seat at Ghurkha Bridge</u> LA said the boards are all gone only the concrete supports are left. RMcI will look at for repair. CC will pay.

<u>Fence at Riverside Path</u> RMcI said that the fence is still an embarrassment on the riverside walk and COAT will not consider funding. Cost could be £2600 but we could do it ourselves cheaper. Cllr JD said that 'Community Pay Back' might do the work.

Containers in Car Park SB asked. Scot Water sewage works. Temporary workshops.

<u>Water tank hatches</u> CR said that these have been removed from the water tank above Lethendry and were lying around. Dangerous if people fell into the sludge. Cllr JD suggested phone the police. CR to action. <u>Riverside walk</u> Some boards have come off fence near OB Garage and one at least is split. SB to contact Adam Streeter-Smith.

<u>Squirrels signs</u> RMcI raised that still complaints about squirrel deaths. Can we get triangular road signs with squirrels? Ask Anna Barton or Stewart Stansfield.
